Old Testament Facts

- 1. 39 Books: Genesis through Malachi
- 2. 32 authors (approx.): All Jewish Men
- 3. Written in the Hebrew Language
 - Called "Classical" or "Biblical" Hebrew
 - Some portions of Daniel & Ezra in Aramaic
- 4. Written over a period of 1400 years
 - From approx. 1800 BC to 400 BC
- 5. Covers 3600 years of human history
 - From approx. 4000 BC to 400 BC

Old Testament Structure

1. A History book

Mostly focuses on the history of the nation of Israel

2. An Instructional book

Mostly under the "Old Covenant" or the "Law of Moses"

3. A Prophetic book

Of many things...

The History of the OT

1. Begins with God creating heaven & earth

Mostly focuses on the earthly realm & God's dealings with man.

2. Man choosing to sin against God's command

Bringing death into the world.

3. Follows the line of the righteous

- Key men like: Noah (father of the new world) & Abraham (father of the Jews)
- This would ultimately lead to the Messiah!

4. Focuses on the nation of Israel

- Their deliverance, establishment, and God's covenant relationship with them.
- Growth into a kingdom; punishment and captivity; regathering of remnant

5. David: the father of the kings

Promised the throne; Jerusalem becomes capital; Solomon builds the temple.

The Instruction of the OT

1. Law & order for natural man on earth

- Keep things in their proper place so that God is glorified and man is loved and kept in line for the good of justice.
- Fear of the Lord, knowledge, wisdom, understanding, discretion, judgment, etc
- Marriage, family, society, government
- Provision for poor, and success for the talented
- Reality of sinful nature and teaches proper judgment for justice and safety.

2. How sinful man should approach the Holy God

- Place of worship & Entrance into Covenant: Word; Altar; Tabernacle; Temple
- Priesthood: offerings, sacrifices, instruction, & worship
- Most of this instruction found in: Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, & Deuteronomy

3. Israel to be an Example to ALL Nations

4. Countless Life Lessons from all of the OT

The Prophecy of the OT

1. Proof to be the word of God!

- Thousands of specific prophecies of future events, places, times, and people.
- Approximately 2,000 are already fulfilled!

2. Topics of Prophecies

- Rise &/or fall of individuals, kings, rulers, nations, kingdoms, & empires.
- Most focus around the nation of Israel, the first coming of Christ, and the second coming of Christ.

3. The 3 Types of Prophecies

- **1. Plain Prophecy:** Says exactly what is meant
- 2. Metaphoric/Vision: Shows some symbolic picture of what is to come
- 3. **Prophetic Picture:** Contained in stories, instructions, articles, etc

4. Most prophecies of Dual Nature

Near term fulfillment; Long Term fulfillment (often around Christ's comings)

Breakdown of the OT

I. 5 Books of Law: History & Instruction

- Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy
- Israel BEFORE they enter the promised land.

II. 12 Books of History of Israel: History

- a) BEFORE the kingdom: Joshua, Judges, Ruth
- b) The Kingdom: 1 & 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings, 1 & 2 Chronicles
- c) After the Kingdom: Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther

III. 5 Books of Wisdom: Instruction & Prophecy

– Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon

IV. 17 Books of Prophets: Prophecy & History

- a) 5 Major Prophets: Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel
- b) 12 Minor Prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi
