The Lordship of Jesus Christ

Introduction: What does "Lord" mean?

Gen. 1:26	And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.	dominion = "lordship" (Latin) dominus = "lord" (Latin) domus = "house"
Gen. 2:4	These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the <u>LORD</u> God made the earth and the heavens,	LORD = English rendering of Hebrew Tetragrammaton יהוה (Jod He Vav He), "JEHOVAH". This is not a title, but a name.
Gen. 15:2	And Abram said, <u>Lord</u> God, what wilt thou give me, seeing I go childless, and the steward of my house is this Eliezer of Damascus?	Lord = translation of (Hebrew) Adonai, "Lord". (Note that when Lord God is used, capitalized God replaces Lord as the rendering of יהוה to avoid "Lord Lord".

The English word *Lord* stems from Old English *hlāford*, which combines *hlāf* ("loaf", "bread") and weard ("keeper", "guardian"). *Lord* is essentially a contraction of "loaf-ward", meaning "keeper of the bread." Over time, it evolved to denote a person of authority or ruler, often associated with the head of a household or landowner, who was responsible for providing food and protection for those under his care. Compare modern *breadwinner*.

Anglo-Saxon oath of fealty to a lord: "By the Lord before whom this sanctuary is holy, I will to [name] be true and faithful, and love all which he loves and shun all which he shuns, according to the laws of God and the order of the world. Nor will I ever with will or action, through word or deed, do anything which is unpleasing to him, on condition that he will hold to me as I shall deserve it, and that he will perform everything as it was in our agreement when I submitted myself to him and chose his will."

Lord, therefore, carries the senses of:

- sovereignty, supreme authority (dominion)
- ruler of a household, manor, land (domain)
- provider, caretaker, nurturer
- keeper of an agreement, covenant

Lord is very similar in origin and meaning to the word *husband* (see 1 Pet. 3:6), which also has an association with "house" (Old Norse: *hus*) and provider, caretaker (as in *husbandman* - James 5:7).

Heb. 3:1-6	 Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our profession, Christ Jesus; Who was faithful to him that appointed him, as also Moses was faithful in all his house. For this man was counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as he who hath builded the house hath more honour than the house. For every house is builded by some man; but he that built all things is God. And Moses verily was faithful in all his house, as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken after; But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end.

Phil. 2:5-11	 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.
