Power Scriptures #1

Text: Matthew 6:25-34 Theme: Trusting God

Key Points:

- 1. God is the Creator and sustainer of his Creation.
 - He sees to it that all things are provided for: grass, flowers, animals, birds, man, etc...
- 2. Man is far more valuable than the rest of the Creation.
 - If God takes care of the small things of his creation, how much more will he not provide for us?
 - If you say you believe in God and want to be true to HIM, don't you think he will especially look out for you?
- 3. Don't worry about even the most basic things like food and clothes.
 - It's time to begin believing in God to make a way for you and to provide for you.
 - God has promised to provide for his own. David said that the righteous will never be forsaken nor their children beg bread (Psalm 37:25).
- 4. Time to seek God's kingdom and do things the right way (his righteousness).
 - All the physical things of this earth are TEMPORARY. They will not last. That is why they cannot impart lasting joy, peace, love, or hope. It is time to not just taste, but to seek, with all your heart, the eternal kingdom of God. God, his kingdom, and the eternal things of HIM will last for ever! And these things give everlasting joy, peace, love, and hope, etc. It's time to really start seeking and investing in the eternal. (2 Corinthians 4:16-18)
 - There Is no space any more for the old ways: hustling, begging, stealing, lying, etc... God cannot bless you the way he wants to if you don't seek HIS righteousness. He loves righteousness and hates sin. He cannot partner with sin. He cannot bless it. You have seen God show himself real and strong to you, Now you must trust him and forsake the sinful ways and start learning how to do things his way: the right way. He will help you, strengthen you, open doors for you, and provide for you all along this path of righteousness! Righteousness is the best life. (Psalm 11:4-7)
